School of the Arts (SOTA) is committed to student success...academic, artistic, and humanistic. We are a learning community that integrates the arts, humanities, and academics, valuing the dignity of self and others while celebrating our diverse community. By holding high standards of performance, we challenge students and staff alike. SOTA's dedication to excellence has earned national recognition, with honors from Newsweek, The Daily Beast, and US News & World Report as one of America's Best High Schools. Our graduates are lifelong learners who understand the privilege and responsibility of contributing to a larger community.

OUR SCHOOL

Nestled in the heart of Rochester's Cultural District, the School of the Arts is a public school for city residents. Approximately 1,160 students attend classes serving Grades 7-12. Upon graduation students receive a School of the Arts High School Diploma with a Fine Arts sequence in one of six subject areas: Creative Writing, Dance, Drama, Music, Theatre Technology or Visual Arts. Students are also required to fulfill New York State exam requirements for the Regents or Advanced Regents Diploma. SOTA celebrates diversity, with a student body consisting of 44.4% African American, 27.4% Hispanic, 23.2% Caucasian, and 5% other backgrounds. Students may enter School of the Arts in Grade 7. Admission for Grade 7 and all subsequent grades is through audition only. Any child who is a resident of the City of Rochester has the right to apply through the RCSD Schools of Choice process.

OUR COMMUNITY

SOTA's three theatres, four dance studios, David Silver Art Gallery, outdoor courtyard and three-story atrium provide students with an architecturally exciting and visually stimulating learning environment. As a prominent member of the Neighborhood of the Arts, there are numerous opportunities for students to experience Rochester's culturally diverse arts scene within walking distance of school. These include: the Memorial Art Gallery, Geva Theater Center, the Visual Studies Workshop, Writers and Books, the Auditorium Theatre Center, the George Eastman House, Garth Fagan Dance, Eastman School of Music, and the Rochester Museum and Science Center/Strasenburgh Planetarium.
