
Montessori students in grades 3/4 will have the opportunity to participate in a reading challenge.

Students will receive tickets for strengthening their reading.


1 ticket for every book or reading passage*

The reading challenge can be done at home or at school during a student's WIN time. Students will only receive tickets if their book summary has a parent or teacher signature.






Students will turn in their <u>signed</u> Book Summary to the library to designate which jar they want their ticket to be entered in (see example below.)



For March, the students whose tickets are chosen will have the opportunity to throw a pie at one of the designated teachers or if they choose, have a pie thrown at them by someone else.

- *Students may also earn 5 extra tickets by creating something to demonstrate their reading.
- Ex: create a poster, booklet, a poem or some other product. (subject to teacher's approval.)



The class that has the most tickets for the month will receive a party with popcorn and a movie.





The teacher of the winning class will receive a 30 minute break (extra planning time- "put your feet up" break or whatever.)



Read along the Alaskan Trail

Students who have read, 10, 20, 25, 50, 100 books will have their name posted along the Alaskan trail.

Any student that reads over 100 books from March to May will participate in the "Alaskan Freeze Day"

Freeze Day could include: freezy pops, snowcones, glow dance party (northern lights), 5'Mores, relay race fun, freeze activities (undo the frozen shirt), etc.
