ALL HS ARE CITYWIDE East Upper **EPO** 




























## **STUDENT TRANSITIONS**

- Students in K-5 remain in their schools if not closing
- 7<sup>th</sup> graders in Northwest, East Lower, SOTA, & WOIS remain
- All other 7<sup>th</sup> graders will attend a 7-8 school in their zone
- Students in closing schools (2, 3, 10, 29, 39, 106, WFA, Franklin Upper, NE College Prep) will participate in a special lottery
- Students with multiple disabilities (GEM) will move to school #45
- NorthSTAR Program students will move to the Franklin Campus
